Other activities incuded:

- Two Kuumba tellers, Deborah Strahorn and Gwendolyn J. Napier were chosen to attend the Wilmington Black Storytelling Residency.
- Deborah Strahorn conducted a youth storytelling workshop with one of our local partners, The Wrens Nest. This is also where the Kuumba Ramblers Akbar Imhotep, Josie Bailey, Gwendolyn J. Napier, and Chetter Galloway share stories with listeners every Saturday.
- Kuumba Members Deborah Strahorn and John Doyle participated in Southview Cemetery Commemoration of the 1906 Atlanta Race Massacre by the sharing stories of Black Atlanta residents impacted by this horrible travesty.
- Kuumba Tattle Tales will have its annual Triple Tales Festival and participate in the Easterseals of Georgia Fall Festival telling stories.
- In November, many Kuumba Members plan on attending the annual NABS Conference.
- December is Kuumba's annual Pre-Kwanzaa celebration.




Kuumba Board of Directors August 2022 Board Meeting Our first live BOD Meeting since February 2020!
