David Anderson, Ph. D./Sankofa is founder of AKWAABA: the Heritage Associates, Inc., and The *Blackstorytelling* League of Rochester, organizations dedicated to enriching public access to African American cultural heritage. In 2000 he co-

directed the 18th Annual *National Association of Black Storytelling (NABS) Festival and Conference*, and was recipient of NABS' Zora Neal Hurston Award.

He crafts living history reenactments that recall the Underground Railroad, as well as the United States Colored Troops, whose Civil War service provided the margin by which the North was able to claim victory, thus, preserve the nation.

In 2018, Anderson was appointed by Congress to the federal commission established to honor the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Frederick Douglass's birth.

Publications include: *The Origin of Life on Earth: an African Creation Myth* (1991); named "Outstanding Children's Book on Africa," and, *Kwanzaa: an Everyday Resource and Instructional Guide* (1992).
